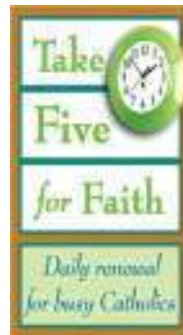

A Way of Experiencing God

Opening up to Mystery

In the Atrium before Advent: (Level 1)

Presentations (*the magic of Montessori....where the beautiful Atrium materials come alive*) are given to children on a *one to one* basis or to *the entire group*.

Especially in the early years, the Montessori concept of “following the child” is practiced in the Atrium. A child will be drawn to the materials that “speak” to them. Through these materials and presentations **Practical Life Skills** (*cutting, rolling, pouring, dusting*) are taught and developed.

Other Presentations:

- **Altar Work** – Children learn about the different articles on the altar and how to set the altar
- **Liturgical Time/Seasons** – Children learn about the different colours and timelines of the Liturgical Seasons and the proper names and parts of the priest’s vestments.
- **Geography** – Showing that Jesus actually did walk on the earth and where this occurred. Through 3 dimensional maps children learn where Israel is located and what its landscape is like. They learn about Nazareth, where Jesus’s parents came from; Bethlehem, where Jesus was born and about Jerusalem, the city Jesus visited and where the temple is.

Catechesis of the Good Shepherd is open **to all** North Bay parishioners aged 3 – 6 (*Level 1*) and aged 6 – 9 (*Level 2*).

November 8, 2015 - 32nd Sunday in Ordinary Time

The first reading tells of how God, from a jar containing a handful of wheat and a jar containing a few drops of oil, provides the Prophet Elijah, the widow of Zarephath and her son with enough food to eat for a year. Hebrews reminds us that Christ intercedes for us at the right hand of the Father in heaven. In the Gospel, Jesus reminds us that we are to serve others with humble and contrite hearts. The example of the poor widow who donated her whole livelihood to the Temple treasury reminds us of two important truths. First, all we have is a gift from God. Second, in love and gratitude for the good gifts God has given us, we are to offer back to him all that we have and all that we are. We can do this by humbly loving and serving God and our neighbor.
