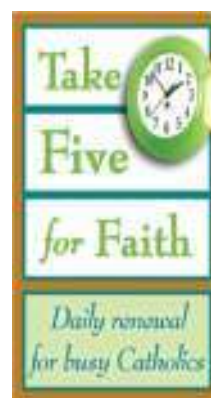
## URGENT - Volunteers Needed

## 17 July 2016 ~ 16<sup>th</sup> Sunday in Ordinary Time



The first reading tells of Abraham encountering God in the messengers who promise him a son. The second reading reminds us of the importance of joining our sufferings to Christ's for the salvation of the world. Today's Gospel tells of Jesus entering a village and visiting with the two sisters, Martha and Mary. As followers of Christ, we are called to hear God's word first, and before all things. Only then can we share it with others, and incorporate his word into our acts of service. As we live and share God's word, we will face trials, but this suffering unites us with Christ. We do this for the sanctification of the world and our own purification.
