
URGENT - Volunteers Needed

June 19, 2016 ~ 12th Sunday in Ordinary Time

The first reading from Zechariah foretells mourning by the inhabitants of Jerusalem over one they have slain, which will be followed by repentance. The second reading reminds us that in and through baptism we are made one in Christ. In the Gospel, Jesus teaches that living as his disciple requires taking up one's cross each day and following him. The Messiah was expected to free the Jewish people from oppression, and restore the freedom and holiness of their nation. Jesus instead reveals that the Messiah will suffer, die and be raised from the dead, and that true discipleship requires self-denial and sacrifice. Understanding this, let us take up our cross each day and follow Jesus.
