The Canadian Catholic Organization for Development and Peace will be Celebrating its 50 Anniversary in 2017. To commemorate 50 years of solidarity work with countries of the Global South, Development and Peace has launched the stitching of a Solidarity Quilt that is travelling the country from West to East (British Columbia to Ontario) and from East to West (Newfoundland to Quebec). Each Canadian diocese has been invited to add a square to the quilt as it passes through. The nationwide pilgrimage was launched on Ash Wednesday, February 10, 2016 and will end during Lent 2017. The squares will then be sewn together to create a huge quilt, and displayed at major national activities.

The 24x24 inch white cotton square for the Diocese of Sault Ste. Marie includes logos from our three major centres: Sault Ste. Marie's logo represents their locks with mountains (one with a cross) and a maple leaf; Sudbury's logo has the Big Nickel with three maple leaves and small smoke stacks; and North Bay's logo is of the Pro-Cathedral and the Gateway Arch. The square also portrays a map of the Diocese of Sault Ste. Marie, the Anishinabe Spiritual Centre Arch, Our Lady of Guadalupe, and five native feathers. All of these logos are enclosed in a large circle made of thin leather. The square was completed by Laura Deschamps, of our Parish.

The squares will be on display at St. Peter's on Saturday, November 19th from 2 – 5 pm and 6 – 7:30 pm. Come see the twenty two squares from other provinces representing Development and Peace celebrating its 50th anniversary.

33rd Sunday in Ordinary Time

The first reading explains that the day is coming when the Lord will punish evildoers, but bring healing to the just. Paul's words in Thessalonians urge those who are idle to keep busy and work quietly to earn their own food. In the Gospel, Jesus tells his disciples that he will give them a *wisdom in speaking* that will render their adversaries *powerless to resist or refute*. Throughout his life and ministry, Jesus taught clearly that there is a cost to living as his faithful disciples. We may be rejected or persecuted for the sake of our faith. We need not fear, however, for Jesus promises to give us the grace and strength to persevere.
