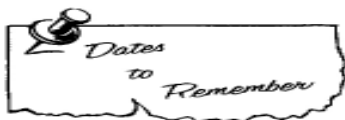

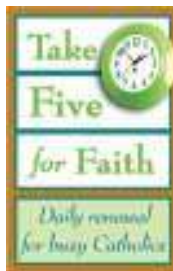
- People in remote villages, towns and cities, through the witness and work of missionaries and local priests;

**Twenty-ninth Sunday in Ordinary Time**
