

Fifth Sunday in Ordinary Time

Jesus said, "In the same way, let your light shine before others, so that they may see your good works and give glory to your Father in Heaven." Matthew 5:16



These words emphasize that we are recognizable as true disciples of the

One who is the Light of the World, not in words, but by our works.

"The light of our faith, in giving of oneself, does not fade but strengthens. However it can weaken if we do not nourish it with love and with charitable works. In this way the image of light complements that of salt. Salt is an ingredient which, while it gives flavour, keeps food from turning and spoiling... Thus, a Christians' mission in society is that of giving "flavour" to life with the faith and the love that Christ has given us, and at the same time, keeping away the contaminating seeds of selfishness, envy, slander, and so on. These seeds degrade the fabric of our communities, which should instead shine as places of welcome, solidarity and reconciliation. Each one of us is called to be light and salt, in the environment of our daily life!" Feb.5,2017

"May our Mother help us to let ourselves always be purified and enlightened by the Lord, so as to become, in our turn, "salt of the earth" and "light of the world."





World Day of the Sick February 11, 2023

Jesus' ministry to the sick is a central part of the life of the Church. Today (also known as a Memorial to Our Lady of Lourdes) highlights the Church's ministry of healing. Instituted 30 years ago by St. John Paul II, the theme for this year is: "Take care of him" (LE 10:35) just as the Samaritan calls the innkeeper. Jesus addresses the same call to each of us. He exhorts us to "go and do likewise" (Lk 10:37).

"The parable shows us how a community can be rebuilt by men and women who identify with the vulnerability of others, who reject the creation of a society of exclusion, and act instead as neighbours, lifting up and rehabilitating the fallen for the sake of the common good" (No. 67). Indeed, "we were created for a fulfilment that can only be found in love. We cannot be indifferent to suffering." (No. 68). Sick people, in fact, are at the centre of God's people, and the Church advances together with them as a sign of a humanity in which everyone is precious and no one should be discarded or left behind. Let us learn from Him, then, how to be a community that truly walks together!


