Marriage


Contact the Pastor at least six months prior to the wedding. A preparation course is required.

Jesus said, "Do not let your hearts be troubled. Believe in God, believe also in me." John 14:1



Faith is...a path of beauty and truth marked out by Jesus to prepare our eyes to gaze without glasses at "the marvellous face of God".

"It is an invitation not to let ourselves be gripped by fear and to live life as a preparation for seeing better, hearing better and loving more.
