“So the twelve went out and proclaimed that all should repent.” Mark 6:12  
 “The Gospel tells of how Jesus sends His disciples into the world to bring healing, just as He

Himself came into the world to heal - to heal the root of sin in us - the original sin. Healing is a bit like creating from anew. Jesus recreated us from the root and then allowed us to move forward with His teaching, with His doctrine, a doctrine that heals. But, the first requisite is that there be conversion.
