### Marriage


Contact the Pastor at least six months prior to the wedding. A preparation course is required.

### **SUNDAY, FEBRUARY 4, 2024**

### Fifth Sunday in Ordinary Time

"He came and took her by the hand and lifted her up." Mark 1:29-39 We have listened to the simple and touching account of the



healing of the mother-in-law of Simon – who is not yet called Peter – in Mark's version of the Gospel.

""He came and took her by the hand"... There is so much tenderness

in this simple act, which seems almost natural: "the fever left her; and she served them" (ibid.). Jesus' healing power meets no resistance; and the person healed resumes her normal life, immediately thinking of others and not of herself – and this is significant; it is the sign of true "health"!

Taking care of the sick of every kind is not an "optional activity" for the Church, no! It is not something extra, no. Taking care of the sick of every kind is an integral part of the Church's mission, as it was for Jesus'. And this mission is to bring God's tenderness to a suffering humanity. Bending down to lift up the other. Let us not forget that the only legitimate way to look at a person from top down is when you stretch out a hand to help them get up. The only one. And this is the mission that Jesus entrusted to the Church.

Closeness, tenderness, compassion are the style of God. God draws near, and He draws near with tenderness and compassion." Feb.7, 2021

May the Holy Virgin help us to allow Jesus to heal us — we always need this, everyone — so that we might in our turn be witnesses to God's healing tenderness.



### World Day of the Sick February 11, 2024

Jesus' ministry to the sick is a central part of the life of the Church. Today (also known as a Memorial to Our Lady of Lourdes) highlights the Church's ministry of healing. Instituted 30 years ago by St. John Paul II, the theme for this year is: "It is not good that man should be alone" (Gen 2:18) - Caring for the sick by caring for relationships. God spoke those words at the beginning of creation and thus revealed to us the profound meaning of His project for humanity.

"Let us remember this central truth in life: we came into the world because someone welcomed us; we were made for love; and we are called to communion and fraternity. This aspect of our lives is what sustains us, above all at times of

illness and vulnerability. It is also the first therapy that we must all adopt in order to heal the diseases of the society in



which we live." To those of you who experience illness, whether temporary or chronic, I would say this: Do not be ashamed of your longing for closeness and tenderness! Do not conceal it, and never think that you are a burden on others. The condition of the sick urges all of us to step back from the hectic pace of our lives in order to rediscover ourselves. The sick, the vulnerable and the poor are at the heart of the Church; they must also be at the heart of our human concern and pastoral attention. May we never forget this! And let us commend ourselves to Mary Most Holy, Health of the Sick, that she may intercede for us and help us to be artisans of closeness and fraternal relationships.
